<u>Abbotsford</u>	<b>Adopt a Park, Street or Trail:</b> Maintain one of over 157 parks in Abbotsford by picking up litter, removing invasive plants, and reporting on vandalism or maintenance problems.	
<u>Abbotsford</u>	<b>Community Clean Up Month:</b> Abbotsford residents are encouraged and supplied with free equipment to pick up litter around their neighborhoods, workplace, and schools, from April 1-30.	
<u>Abbotsford</u>	<b>Storm Drain Troopers:</b> This program provides kits to volunteers to paint bright yellow fish above storm drains to help remind folks that what goes in the storm drain matters.	
<u>Abbotsford</u>	<b>Lets Talk Abbotsford:</b> Call outs from the City of Abbotsford for residents to provide their feedback on a multitude of projects, from park planning to walking infrastructure to flood mitigation planning.	
<u>Chilliwack</u>	<b>Engage Chilliwack:</b> Call outs from the City of Chilliwack for residents to provide their feedback on a multitude of projects, from their climate action plan to water conservation to curbside recycling.	
<u>Chilliwack</u>	<b>Guided Nature Sessions:</b> Join the City's Guided Nature Sessions to learn about plants, wildlife, and unique natural processes around us in over 400 hectares of Chilliwack's green space.	
<u>Langley</u>	<b>Public Engagement Opportunities:</b> Engagement opportunities for residents of the Township of Langley to participate in surveys, open houses, and give their input on plans and projects in the works.	
<u>Langley</u>	<b>Adopt-a-Program:</b> Choose a street, park, trail, or creek to adopt. Commit to cleaning the litter in an area for one year and the Township will provide cleaning supplies, safety information, garbage removal, and a sign to recognize your efforts.	
<u>Mission</u>	<b>Engage Mission:</b> Call outs from the City of Mission for residents to provide their feedback on a multitude of projects, from community wellness strategies, to neighborhood planning to land clearing management.
