

Habitat Healers Service Seeds Rewards Program Requirements Q&A

Q: What can you do, and where can you do it?

A: Actions qualifying for Service Seeds Rewards include:

- **AT HOME:** planting native plants, removing invasive species, other Service Seeds activities (in progress)
- **IN YOUR COMMUNITY:** garbage clean up in parks or public areas, participating in events that help heal nature with other groups, sharing information about caring for healthy habitats with friends and neighbours.

Q: What is **not appropriate** for this level of the program?

A: You must be mindful of the work you do in the community. Actions in parks, roadsides, or other private properties are limited to garbage clean ups ONLY.

- Do not plant plants in a park unless working with a qualified environmental group.
- Do not remove invasive plants from a park unless working with a qualified environmental group.

Q: How do I get the Service Seeds?

A: To collect Service Seeds you must record what you did through the online Airtable tracking form. If you do not track your activities accurately, your Service Seeds will not be counted.

Q: What should I keep in mind when I am in the community collecting Service Seeds?

A: When you are a Habitat Healer out in the community collecting Service Seeds, you represent the Fraser Valley Conservancy and our values. Sometimes other members of the public might question you about what you are doing. Always be polite to passersby and hand out our business cards to those who ask questions or who are confrontational.
