As the year draws to a close, I want to take a moment to reflect on the incredible contributions each of you has made to the Fraser Valley Conservancy. From the youngest, just 6 years old, to those in their 80s, you have brought a diversity of energy, experience, and passion to our efforts.

You've come to us not only from the Fraser Valley but from cities as far as Langley, Surrey, and Vancouver. Among you are biologists, teachers, city staff, parents, grandparents, students, and professionals from countless other walks of life. Together, you represent a vibrant tapestry of backgrounds, united by a shared love for nature and a commitment to restoring it.

This year, we had the joy of welcoming over 90 new faces to our volunteer events! It was amazing to see so many individuals joining our mission, eager to contribute and make a difference.





